This is a very special year for my wife and me because we celebrate our Golden Wedding Anniversary. We both thank God for His many blessings experienced in our marriage over these last 50 years. That in itself is something to celebrate. Thinking about our anniversary, it suddenly occurred to me that the UK has several outstanding anniversaries this year.

Last February saw our Queen's Sapphire Anniversary - i.e. 65 years since she ascended the throne. Her Majesty spent the day at Sandringham in quiet contemplation, remembering the death of her father. Two eventful centenaries are celebrated this year - namely: the end of the First World War in 1918; and the formation of the Royal Air Force by the merger of the *Royal Flying Corp* and the *Royal Naval Air Service*. Last month saw the first anniversary of the Grenfell Tower Disaster in London; that was a very sad reminder that not all anniversaries bring occasion for rejoicing.

Interestingly, while I'm only focusing on the UK it is fascinating to note that during the course of this year over 5,000 newsworthy and notable anniversaries will occur throughout the entire world, many of them in the UK. We may be interested to note that 100 years ago, women gained the right to vote in Great Britain and Ireland. 90 years ago, the London & North Eastern Railway's Flying Scotsman steam-hauled express train commenced its non-stop journey from London King's Cross to Edinburgh. As we have been reminded recently in the news, causing scandal for the British Government, it was 70 years ago that the Empire Windrush docked in London with 500 Jamaican immigrants. It was 30 years ago that Margaret Thatcher became the longest-serving UK Prime Minister; she was in office for 8 years and 244 days! The first journey of the highspeed train from France to London through the Channel Tunnel took place 25 years ago.

These are fascinating facts and may surprise some of us that certain events took place much earlier than we may have imagined. That highlights the reality that, as the old saying goes, 'Time flies'! It certainly appears to do so. As my wife and I reflect over the events in our married life together, some things just don't seem to have been as far back in time as they actually have. Is that an indication that we have been happy together? I would like to think that it is.

God also has anniversaries for us to celebrate. The Sabbath is a very important one as each week we celebrate His love in Creation and Redemption. Baptism is another in which we celebrate Christ's resurrection and the new life we receive in Him when we begin the Christian life. We celebrate His sacrificial death for our redemption by sharing in Holy Communion; and by this same ordinance, Jesus also directed us to look forward to His soon return. I wonder what anniversaries we shall celebrate in His Kingdom? I can think of one passage that drops a hint in that direction: check it out, it's found in Isaiah 66:22.23.

ADRA Europe Active in Helping Greek Fire Victims



With more than 85 dead, hundreds injured, and more than 1,200 homes destroyed following deadly wildfires near Athens, Greece, ADRA (Adventist Disaster Relief Agency) is working to provide support. The fires, thought to be the deadliest on record, broke out on Monday 23 July.

Despina Tologlou is the lead person for ADRA operations in Greece and was running an evening event supporting refugees in Katerini, 500 km north of Athens when news of the fire came through. Immediately she transformed the event in the park as a fund raiser. Local citizens donated bottled water, food and hygiene items, basic medications and baby supplies, to assist those affected by the fire. Over 240 boxes were provided.

Working with the authorities, ADRA is now in the process of distributing additional supplies in the affected areas. João Martins, ADRA Europe Director said: "ADRA Europe is working together with the ADRA network to support initiatives in Greece during this emergency." Adventist Hospital in Berlin Helping Victims of Female Genital Mutilation

Over 350 victims of female genital mutilation (FGM) have received medical attention at the *Desert Flower Centre (DFC)* located in the Waldfriede Adventist Hospital in Zehlendorf, Berlin, Germany. The centre was launched in 2013 with the support of former top model Waris Dirie.

On June 21, 2018, Dirie spoke at the 6th *Live Surgery Symposium*, entitled 'Innovations in Proctology', held at the hospital with 300 doctors in attendance. "More *Desert Flower Centres* must be established around the world," she said. According to United Nations statistics, more than 250 million women worldwide are affected by this damaging procedure.

Dirie, 53, became widely known through her biography *Desert Flower* and the film of the same name. In it, the native of Somalia, who herself was a victim of FGM at the age of 5, describes her path of suffering and recovery. Waldfriede, a cooperating hospital of the *Desert Flower Foundation* launched by Dirie in Vienna in 2002, is the first institution in the world to look after the victims of FGM wholistically.
