A Word in Season . . .

I recently read a report in Release International (the voice of persecuted Christians). November 2017, in which it related the experience of six Indian Christians who paid a heavy price for praying for someone to be healed. They were praying over a woman who was sick when Hindu extremists attacked them. When the police arrived, these Christians were summoned, two of them were severely beaten by the officers. They were all falsely charged and thrown into prison for a month! Yet, during their time in prison they praised God and that resulted in leading several of their fellow inmates to Christ.

This reminds me of the experience of Paul and Silas when they were in the ancient city of Philippi (Acts 16:11-40). They were publicly flogged for proclaiming the way of salvation; and then they were thrust into the local jail with their feet secured in the stocks. They too, like those six Christians in India, prayed and sang praises to God. The outcome was rather dramatic with the jailor asking how he could be saved. Both he and his entire family were converted and baptized. What a witness!

Christians have always suffered for their beliefs and, no doubt, will continue to do so until Jesus returns in glory; but their sufferings are not without witness. It was Tertullian who stated that "the blood of martyrs is the seed of the church", signifying that non-believers recognized they had something worth dying for, and this led many others to become believers. It is a fact that in spite of attempts throughout history to wipe out Christianity, it has survived and grown!

As Christians, we do have something to die for and something to live for. That something is of eternal benefit to all who believe. At the end of this month, the Christian Church will be celebrating that great redemptive act when Christ gave His life on Calvary's cross for everyone; and then rose again from the dead. He too had something to die for and something to live for. That something is the human race. He

Paid the price for all our sins and redeemed us by His blood. The fact He rose again grants us the assurance of having peace with God and eternal life. "He was handed over to die because of our sins, and he was raised to life to make us right with God" - Rom.4:25, New Living Translation. - Michael I Walker

The last verses of Mark's Gospel has 75 such heptadic or sevenfold features identified.



We shall all be judged according to the Law of God's 10 Commandments (Eccl.12:13,14; James 2:8-13).

The Judgement scene in heaven is revealed when the books are opened (Dan.7:9,10).

Records are kept in heaven: -

- \circ God keeps an account of our sufferings (Psa.56:8);
- There is a Book of Remembrance (Malachi 3:16-18);
- There is a Book of Life (Phil.4:3);
- The Book of Life contains the names of the saved (Dan. 12: 1);
- The unrepentant will be blotted out of the Book of Life (Exod.32:33);
