As he came up out of the water, 103-year-old Carlos raised his hands in victory, rejoicing at having accepted Jesus as his personal Saviour. Church members at the Youth Centre of the *East Puerto Rico Adventist Conference* in San Juan, celebrated with him as they witnessed his baptism by immersion on 11 August last.

"Jesus is my life, and it is He that strengthens me," he said, speaking about his decision. He was born in 1914. His decision came after attending an evangelistic series in the San Jose Adventist Church, in the capital city of San Juan.

One is never too old to accept Christ as their Saviour. This is a choice available to *all* because Jesus died for *all* people.

Persecution of Christians . . .

- ☒ An 18-yr old Christian student has been told by doctors that she'll never walk again after being pushed from a second-floor building in Karachi, Pakistan. Binish had been stalked for months by a man who wanted to marry her and convert her to Islam. When she refused his approach, he got angry and started beating her. After that he took her to a building and threw her from the second floor. Her legs and spine have been fractured, and she'll never be able to walk or sit again.
- ☒ At least 27 people and a church pastor recently died following raids by Fulani militants on five Christian communities in northeast Nigeria between September 13-16. Many drowned while trying to escape.
- ☒ Several Christians are imprisoned for being Christians, frequently accused of blasphemy or some other charge that has not been substantiated.
- ☒ Jiang Tianyong, an imprisoned Christian lawyer in China - his family is seriously concerned as his memory has deteriorated after being given drugs by prison officials.
- ☒ Also, let us remember those Muslims who are also incarcerated in Chinese centres 'for re-education' (prison camps), as reported on BBC Television News.
