Seventh-day Adventists practice the baptism of repentance for believers according to the Biblical method - i.e. by immersion. The word *Baptizō* in Greek, means 'to dip', 'to plunge', 'to immerse'. The Biblical symbolism is explained in the New Testament Book of Romans chapter 6. It likens immersion to the death of the old, sinful life by burying it in the watery grave; and the raising of the new life (i.e. New Birth) by rising out of the watery grave. That death, burial and resurrection is by faith "in Christ" Who died for our sins, was buried and rose again to put us right with God. It is a very beautiful service that is full

of meaning. By faith in Jesus, we are made new again by being united in Christ our personal Saviour.
